Through these reading relationships, students build core literacy skills, expand their horizons, and develop essential social-emotional and interpersonal skills—all key indicators of future success in the classroom and beyond.

That's why StoryTime offers two ways for volunteers to share stories with children—by reading aloud from a selected text, modeling positive literacy behaviors and introducing important themes and concepts; or by presenting books that speak to their own experiences, such as career exploration or overcoming obstacles.


